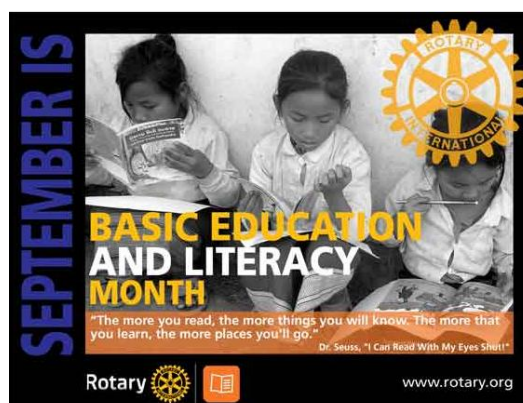

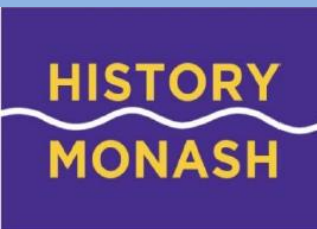

Volunteer Youth Forms

"All members - following up on working with children checks – it is imperative that all members who may come in contact – even incidental - with children (those under 18) have a working with children's card (WWC) – most members have one but for those that do not could you apply for one ASAP and advise Michael once its received. It costs nothing to apply for a card as a volunteer – you can apply using this link [Working with Children Check \(service.vic.gov.au\)](http://service.vic.gov.au)

Now for the additional requirement of a Form 3 – as explained by the District Youth Chair – Ken Mirams – this is an additional requirement imposed by both the Victorian Government, Rotary International and for insurance purposes. The Form 3 is an extra check particularly for those situations where you may at any time be in a one-on-one situation with a child (anyone under 18), in those cases you must have both the WWC card and a completed Form 3.

Trust that this clarifies – incidental contact with children (not one on one) a WWC check is sufficient – in situations where you will or may be one on one then a Form 3 must be completed. Of course, logistically it makes planning a lot easier if we all have both the WWC card and a Form 3"

Beguiled in Barcelona

To discover the 2027 Rotary International Convention host city, start by getting lost

In just a few steps, we've traveled through 2,000 years of Barcelona's history. The ruins of a Roman temple. A medieval church sheltering the relics of the city's martyred patron saint. A mosaic-covered modernist concert hall. Every corner we turn there are more quaint buildings, more quiet courtyards filled with greenery and fountains and artwork.

I know I'm jet-lagged, but that's not why my mind is spinning. Albert Torras, a journalist who moonlights as a tour guide and who has joined me for the afternoon, reassures me. "The best thing to do in Barcelona is to get lost here in the center," he says.

I landed in Barcelona a few hours ago to experience for myself the charms that draw so many people to this city, which will host the 2027 Rotary International Convention 26-30 June. Torras, a member of the Rotary Club of Barcelona Alba, and Montse Moral of the Rotary Club of Sant Cugat del Vallès had met me at the Gran Hotel Havana after I regrouped from my flight. The historic luxury hotel, built in 1882, is the home base of the Rotary Club of Barcelona and my home for the next few days.

As we walked toward the city's Gothic Quarter, Torras regaled me with the history of Barcelona and its region, Catalonia. Romans founded the city at the end of the 1st century BC, calling it Barcino. In the mid-12th century, Catalonia became part of the Crown of Aragon, which went on to conquer parts of the Western Mediterranean, including Valencia, Sicily, Sardinia, Naples, and Athens. "It was the most important country in the Mediterranean in the 12th, 13th, and 14th centuries," Torras says.

There's more to say, but that brings us to where we're standing right now, at the entry to the Gothic Quarter. The neighborhood was built up around the time that Barcelona was a Mediterranean powerhouse. As we wander around, we pass the ornate Barcelona Cathedral, dedicated to St. Eulalia, martyred at the age of 13 during the 4th century persecution of Christians throughout the Roman Empire. And speaking of the Romans, the cathedral is inside the original Roman city. Torras points out the large stone blocks at the base of nearby structures. These are the original Roman walls; the smaller bricks farther up were placed later.

We continue down a narrow street next to the church, and the atmosphere is more subdued. We see the old royal palace with its crown-shaped tower and pass the Archives of the Crown of Aragon, which holds several UNESCO-recognized documents.

To explain those, it's time for more of that history lesson. In 1469, Ferdinand II of Aragon married Isabella of nearby Castile, setting the stage for the unification of Spain. In 1492, they sponsored

Christopher Columbus' voyages to the New World, launching the country into its role as a global power. Historical documents related to Columbus' expeditions are housed at the Aragon archives.

The Catalan merchants who found their fortunes in the Americas are responsible for the architecture that Barcelona might be best known for — that of the Modernisme movement.

I get my first taste of the Catalan Modernist architecture just outside the Gothic Quarter in the Palau de la Música Catalana, perhaps the building that stands out most in my postflight brain fog. The UNESCO World Heritage Site is adorned with mosaic pillars with floral motifs and busts of famous composers. If you don't have time for a tour of the inside, go around the corner and grab a coffee from the first-floor café, where you can admire the ceramic flowers and stained glass incorporating the natural themes typical of the movement.

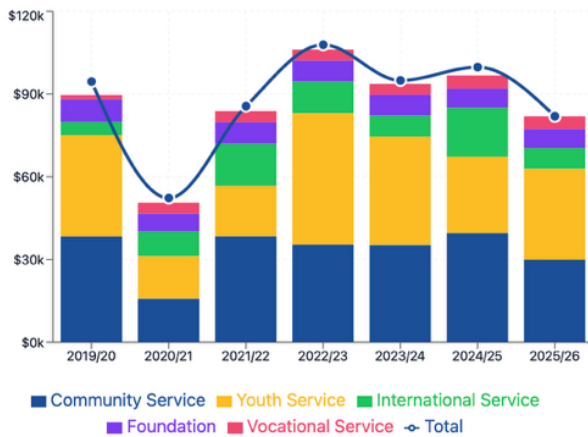

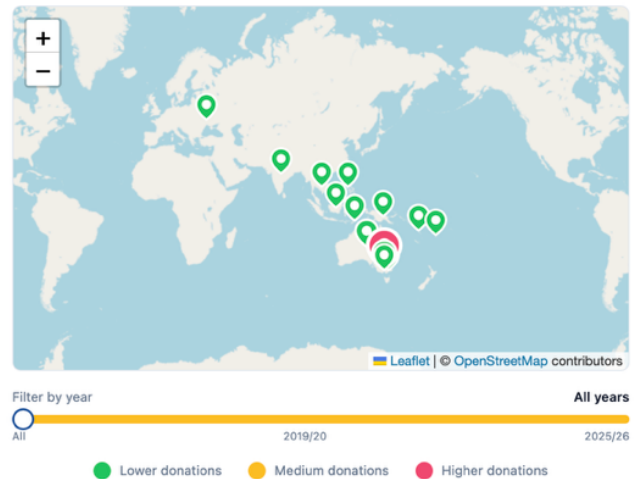
Donation Trends Over Time

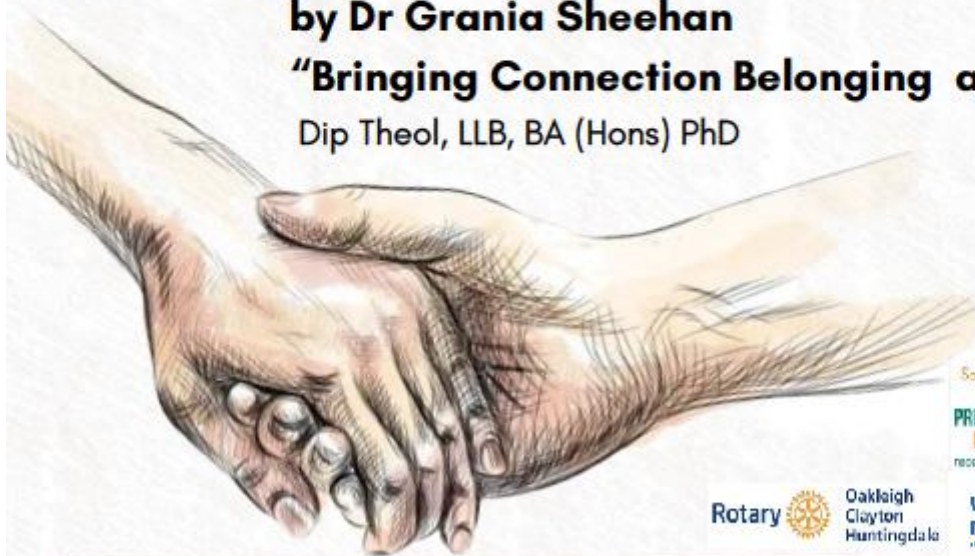
